Available for Students in Grades 5-12



This is a great alternative to students in our program who may not want to do IEA but do want to be recognized as an Equestrian athlete. We can help you do this. You don't have to be a record setting quarterback, point guard or track star to letter in junior high or high school sports anymore. The US Equestrian Federation is writing a new chapter in the recognition of student athletes – one that honors Equestrians. Being a part of this program will be a great opportunity to demonstrate your commitment and can be included with future college applications or future resumes. The US Equestrian Athlete Lettering Program is open to equestrian athletes in all breeds or disciplines English and Western who are currently members of US Equestrian or become US Equestrian members. Students participating in the program need to record 100 hours of riding or training and three competitions of any level or type to complete the requirements for that year.

The program runs from June 1-May 31 of each year and will honor those who document their training and competition involvement by awarding emblems & pins.

The Equestrian Reserve riding lesson program, camps and show team participation in at least three RHSC shows in a year can easily add up to the required hours. Talk to Donna to find out more about this. We have packets you can pick up.

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
